


Happy Lunar New Year from Delta College's APIASA! Celebrating the Year of the Ox!

Lunar New Year (also known as 'Spring Festival') is a time for a fresh outlook and new beginnings! Dating back thousands of years in many parts of Asia, the new year on the lunar calendar kicks off 15-days of celebration where families come together to wish one another happiness, health, and most of all -- fortune! One common superstition dictates that what you do within this period determines what you'll be doing all year long, so strenuous work and conflicts are generally avoided during this time. Instead, homes are filled with large feasts where traditional foods associated with good luck are consumed as well as time spent catching up with loved ones.



In Chinese astrology, this also marks the beginning of a new zodiac sign where 2020's 'Year of the Rat' makes way for 2021's 'Year of the Ox.'

Those born during the Year of the Ox are known for being loyal, steady, and diligent people. Characterized by their patience in decision-making, Oxen often achieve their goals by making definite plans and following through with consistent effort. They are also known for attaching importance to their family and work commitments and are considered the most dependable of the 12 animals in the Chinese zodiac!

No other celebration on earth sees as many fireworks lit as the *billions* set off in China at midnight to mark the beginning of the Lunar New Year! Fireworks have also been traditionally used to scare away evil spirits.

On the 15th day of celebrations, the Lunar New Year festivities officially conclude with the lighting of red lanterns, followed by a firework finale and the eating of sweet dumplings!
