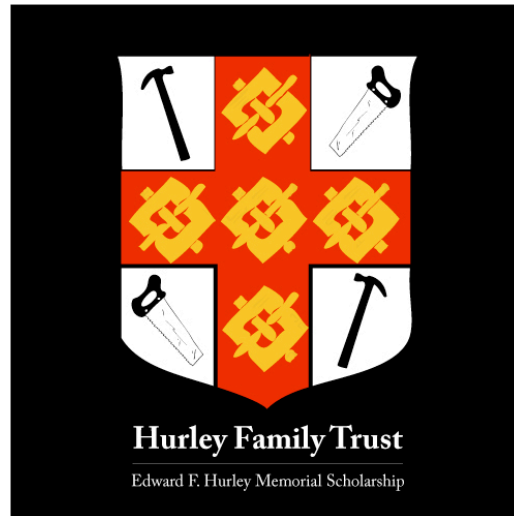

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION



The Hurley Family Trust- Edward F. Hurley Memorial Scholarship is designed to promote educational opportunities for children of tradesmen, including carpenters, plumbers, electricians, and other skilled workers in the construction trades. Mr. Hurley attended college briefly after high school, but he did not have the opportunity to complete his formal education as it was necessary to work. He was a member of the Carpenters Union for nearly 60 years, and he provided the opportunity for all five children to attend college.

He believed in the opportunity for all children to attend college, and he encouraged his own children and grandchildren to be lifelong learners. He was a voracious reader, and he was self-educated in many subject areas. The scholarship is designed to assist children of construction workers in attending San Joaquin Delta College with priority giving to first-generation college students. The Edward F. Hurley Memorial Scholarship is prepared to offer from \$500 to \$1000 for successful applicants based upon need.

Requirements:

- 1) Attendance at an accredited high school within the city of Stockton or attending Calaveras High School in San Andreas (Mr. Hurley’s alma mater) or
- 2) Current full or part-time student enrolled at San Joaquin Delta Community College
- 3) One or more parents must be employed in the construction trades
- 4) Priority is given to the first generation student attending college

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Applications must include the following in order to be complete:

High school or Delta College transcript (current)
Completed application form
Three letters of recommendation pertaining to:
 Scholarship ability
 Personal reference
 Work-related experience

Application and related forms must be submitted online to the following email address – edwardhurleyhurleyscholarship@gmail.com. Applications will be accepted on a year-round basis and awards will be distributed to qualified candidates. Submit transcript and letters of recommendation in PDF form.

There is no limit to the number of applications that may be submitted from any school district, provided each applicant has complied with the rules as stated above.

Scholarship checks will be sent to the Registrar of San Joaquin Delta Community College, to be deposited to the student’s account.
