Pacific Equity (FCAPE) Co-Chairs, Dr. Cirian Villavicencio & Janice Takahashi

As we begin a new year, the Faculty Caucus on Asian and Pacific Equity (FCAPE) remains committed to advance initiatives to empower our Asian American Native Hawaiian Pacific Islander (AANHPI) community - our students, faculty, administrators, and staff.

Through the hard work and diligence of our steering committee and strong support from administration, below is a list of last semester's accomplishments we are proud to highlight:

- Started implementation of the Asian American Native American Pacific Islander Serving Institution (AANAPISI) Collaborative Federal Grant (with Sacramento State, the Los Rios Colleges, and Sierra College) to improve transfer pathways for our students
- Celebrated Filipino-American History Month
- Dedicated the EPICENTER, a new academic and social space for our AANHPI students
- The Board of Trustees unanimously ratified the historic API Disaggregation Resolution, committing the district to disaggregate data to identify equity gaps among our AANHPI subgroups.

San Joaquin Delta College's Board of Trustees Unanimously Ratifies AAPI Data Disaggregation Resolution

On Tuesday, December 14, 2021, the San Joaquin Board of Trustees had unanimously approved the Faculty Caucus for Asian Pacific Equity's (FCAPE) AAPI Data Disaggregation Resolution. It was a memorable historical event for our community to address and to clarify the Model Minority Myths.

The San Joaquin Delta College's Teachers' Association (SJDCTA), San Joaquin Delta College's Academic Senate, and SJDCTA's Social Justice Committee had also ratified and supported the AAPI Data Disaggregation Resolution before the board voted on it to ensure in the future AAPI students' data get disaggregated. Also, it will help most disproportionally impacted AAPI student's close academic needs and gaps. The Academic Senate supported the resolution and presented it to the Board of Trustees for a vote of approval.

FCAPE Outreach Committee members would like to thank everyone who supported us in this historical event and to the San Joquin Delta College Board of Trustees for approving this special resolution and thank you Counselor/Professor, FCAPE Co-Chair, and 1st VP of the Academic Senate, Ms. Janice Takahashi; Political Science Professor, APIASA President, and FCAPE Co-Chair Dr. Cirian Villavicencio; and History Professor Dr. Wesley Swanson representing SJDCTA for your endless support and in delivering the public comments for this resolution.


