

Most locals will visit their hometown and spend time with family during the celebrations. connected, providing useful tips from her
own teaching practices.



Outstanding Accomplishment!

Dr. Villavicencio was one of three commissioners form the California Commission on Asian and Pacific Islander American Affairs (CAPIAA) to engage in a conversation with White House officials on Feb. 25, 2022. He was privileged to meet Ms. Erika Moritsugu, President Biden's Deputy Assistant and senior liaison for AANHPI affairs and Ms. Krystal Ka'ai, Executive Director of the White House Initiative on AANHPIs.

During the hour-long discussion, Dr. Villavicencio was given an opportunity to share some important issues affecting our California AANHPI students as chair of CAPIAA's Higher Education Equity Committee. He spoke about the importance of continued data disaggregation within the AANHPI community; increased mental health resources for AANHPI students; sustained funding for AANAPISI federal grants; and encouraged the administration to take further action in legalizing the status of our DACA/Dreamer students, many of whom are AANHPIs. According to Dr. Villavicencio, "This is only the beginning as our commission will now partner with the White House to expand resources and services to our communities at both the state and federal levels. It was an honor to represent the state of California, the Central Valley, Stockton, and San Joaquin Delta College."







Meet Author Jean Kwok

Dr. Pamela Pan, Professor of English, has invited New York Times and international bestselling author Jean Kwok to do a virtual presentation for Delta College students, faculty, and staff. Ms. Kwok will speak about her prize-winning, international bestselling novel *Girl in Translation* and the inspiration behind it, and her own experience moving from impoverished immigrant to Harvard graduate to bestselling author. She will cover themes of the American Dream, race, identity, culture, rejection, success, and failure.



Jean Kwok Bio:

Jean Kwok is the award-winning, *New York Times* and international bestselling author of *Girl in Translation*, *Mambo in Chinatown*, and *Searching for Sylvie Lee*, which was a Read with Jenna Today Show Book Club pick, a Belletrist pick, and an instant *New York Times* bestseller. Her work has been published in twenty countries and is taught in schools across the world. She has been selected for numerous honors, including the American Library Association Alex Award, the Chinese American Librarians Association Best Book Award, an Orange New Writers title, and the *Sunday Times* Short Story Award international shortlist. She immigrated from Hong Kong to Brooklyn when she was five and worked in a Chinatown clothing factory for much of her childhood. She received her bachelor's degree from Harvard University and earned an MFA from Columbia University. She currently lives in the Netherlands.
