
# **Black History LibGuide**




### Lecture Series: Pre-colonial / Colonial Politics and Revolution in Africa Lecture

Conducted by Prof. Chigozie Enwere PhD, the central objective of this lecture is to situate the historical and political conditions underlying the course of political revolution of colonial African States. Decolonisation, Pan Africanism, revolutionary movements and struggle for the control of Africa by Africans will be investigated. A central concern of the course will be to examine the premises of divergence between the philosophy of African revolution and the contending theoretical perspectives of Anglo-American revolution. Trends and patterns of colonial African revolutions in North Africa will be clearly highlighted as well as political and economic linkages in colonial Africa.

### **Black Businesses Unite**


Black Businesses Unite was planned by our Black Student Union and took place on Saturday, February 25th from noon to 2 pm in the Marcopoulos gym.



## **Black Nursing Information Session**

On February 27th, The nursing department led a recruitment session focused on recruiting Black and minority students. The department discussed the pre-requisite requirements to become an SJDC Registered Nursing student including discussions on steps potential students could follow if their high school GPA is not optimal. This covered options as a high school student through dual enrollment. Furthermore, we defined TEAS testing and how students could be successful. During the discussion, we covered program requirements and realistic costs.

This informational session was designed as a safe space for African American Students, and we talked through the stop gaps African American students face as prospective nursing students. Students heard first hand experiences from a current African American Nursing Student. The session was open to parents and familial support.
