

Through the hard work and diligence of our steering committee and strong support from the administration, below is a list of the spring semester's accomplishments we are proud to highlight:

- Welcomed our new faculty hires for Asian American History (Professor Bernard Remollino) and Asian American Ethnic Studies (Professor Eugene Gambol)


The following are on-going initiatives that are being moved forward:

- Campus Climate: Resolution to rename West Forum in memory of Dr. Dawn Bohulano Mabalon, Delta College alumna, co-founder of Little Manila Rising, and author of Little Manila is in the Heart; APPROVED!
- Curriculum: Revival of Asian language courses (i.e. Chinese, Tagalog, Hindi, Punjabi)
- Grants: In collaboration with the Department of Political Science, apply for the Fulbright Hays Program to bring faculty and students to the Philippines and Japan (Summer 2024)
- Started the second year of AANAPISI Collaborative Grant with Sacramento State, Los Rios Colleges, and Sierra College
- Professional Development: CSU Fresno's presentation on "Developing Inclusive Leadership Lenses for Culturally Responsive Allyship"
- AANHPI Data Disaggregation: FCAPE continues to work with the Office of Institutional Research and Effectiveness to better disaggregate AANHPI student and employee data. More granular AANHPI student disaggregated data will help the district target disproportionally impacted AANHPI students to close equity and opportunity gaps

Dr. Villavicencio leads effort to secure \$16 million ongoing funding for California AANHPI higher education achievement

Governor Newson has officially signed the CA Budget It includes Dr. Villavicencio's API

State commission's higher education budget request of \$8 million on-going for California Community College AND \$8 million on-going for CSU to fund AANAPISI-eligible colleges and universities to serve first-generation, underserved, and under resourced AANHPI students. Mirrored on the successes of Puente (that serves our Latinx/Hispanic students) and UMOJA (that serves our black/African American students), this new funding called the AANHPI Student Achievement Program will target our most vulnerable AANHPI students who struggle to access, stay, and complete their higher education goals. As chair of the Higher Education & Equity Committee, Dr. Villavicencio with his commission staff is working on the implementation process. He foresees that this could potentially bring in between \$150K to \$200K every year to Delta College to support AANHPI programs like the EPIC Learning Community.

Renaming West Forum in honor of Dr. Dawn Mabalon was Approved!



The Board of Trustees passed our resolution to rename the largest lecture hall (West Forum) on campus to the " **Dawn Mabalon Forum**" in honor of the late Delta College alumna, Filipina historian, scholar, and activist, Dr. Dawn Bohulano Mabalon!

A special recognition goes to Debra Louie and Janice Takahashi for helping to lead and write the resolution for FCAPE! Congratulations, everyone! This is a historic vote that will allow our students to learn more about Dawn's legacy to preserve Filipino American history and to advocate for social and environmental justice!

Dr. Mabalon passed away unexpectedly at the age of 45 while she was on vacation in Kauai with her family. She was a champion in the Filipino community, a nationally recognized scholar, passionate community activist, respected historian, and award-winning author. Her book, "Little Manila is in the Heart: The Making of the Filipino American Community in Stockton, California," elevated the histories of Filipinos in Stockton to a national level and provided an important historical perspective for generations to come.

The West Forum will now be known as the Dawn Mabalon Forum!

Hate crimes for Asian Americans spiked 178% in California

On June 28, 2022, Dr. Villavicencio was invited to speak at a press conference with Attorney General Rob Bonta in his role as API statewide commissioner. The California DOJ released their annual hate crime report that saw hate crimes for all groups (except transgender individuals) increase by 33% in California in 2021. Tragically, hate crimes for Asian Americans spiked 178% within that same time period.

Bonta said hate crimes in 2021 shot up 33% to nearly 1,800 reported incidents. That is the sixth highest tally on record and the highest since after the 9/11 terrorist attack in 2001.


Asian American Institutions and Ideals, Asian American Activism, and Asian American Popular Culture.

I currently live in San Francisco, where I am conducting research for an upcoming book project that expands on my dissertation. I write for the Filipinx newspaper, *Mahalaya*, and support several Filipino American organizations across California in amplifying the histories of struggle and community building that make Filipinx experiences part of the larger fabric of U.S. history.

Pchum Ben, also known as Ancestors Day or Caring for the Dead Ritual, is one of the most important Buddhist holidays in Cambodia. Pchum Ben is a two-week Buddhist holiday, three days of which are a Cambodian public holiday. In Khmer, the word Ben means "to collect." Alternatively, Ben also refers to cupping or forming cooked rice into portions. To Ben Baht is the practice of collecting food to give to monks. The word Pchum roughly translates to, "to congregate or meet together."
